



Our International Bachelor and Master Programs

The InterCultural Center (ICC) at Salzburg College (SC) comprises two main departments:

- The Department of Intercultural and Communication Studies (ICS)
- The Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders – Multilingual, Multicultural and Intergenerational Concerns (CSD)

The InterCultural Center proudly offers academic programs in collaboration with our US-American partner university. Jointly we award Bachelor and Master desgrees and provide Faculty and Student Research opportunities.

All Bachelor and Master programs will be offered in compact, structured form ensuring that students complete their studies in the shortest possible time. The programs will focus on academic as well as on professional and global learning. Upon graduation, students will have grown academically as well as personally, gained work experience in Europe and abroad, acquired a B2 level certificate in a foreign language (German or Spanish) and will have become interculturally competent. Enrolment for the Bachelor and Master programs is limited and highly selective.


Our Ph.D. program in Leadership and Policy with the special emphasis on Intercultural and Global Issues offers graduate students a unique international and cultural experience.

The Institute for Intercultural and Communication Research (ICR)

The InterCultural Center at Salzburg College has established the Institute for Intercultural and Communication Research (ICR) in order to facilitate research in the field of Intercultural Studies. At the ICR state-of-the-art research and solution finding are combined to offer practicable results for the various social and cultural challenges our multicultural societies are faced with. The long term goal is to continue building a cluster of experts from around the globe to enhance the research in this field.

The Salzburg Institute for Reading Research (SIRR)

SIRR Research Unit Director: Prof. Dr. Thomas Kaltenbacher

The Salzburg Institute for Reading Research (SIRR) is an interdisciplinary research unit at Salzburg College which explores all aspects and facets of reading. We conduct research into literacy-related skills for typically developing readers and those who struggle (with a special emphasis on dyslexia). Our research interest is also directed towards bilingual children's language abilities and early reading outcomes.

The Culture and Science Laboratory (CSL)

This core laboratory facility for intercultural and communication disorders research has been established for our students and researchers in residence. Currently we offer hands-on practice and research collaboration in Eyetracking and Ultra-Sound Studies at the CSL.

At the Intercultural Academy (IA) various tailored seminars and workshops are offered. All courses are designed to meet your individual/organizational needs and interests. Sample list of seminars:

1. Leading in Austria

Taking up a leadership position in a new country can cause extra stress for a person in a leadership position and her/his team. In order to successfully prepare for a leadership position in Austria this course offers individualised tutoring to leaders by introducing skillsets, mindsets and heartsets of the Austrian people. This context-specific as well as general cultural knowledge will guarantee a successful start in the Austrian workplace and is invaluable for anyone new to a leadership position.

2. Are you fit for Workplace Diversity?


The Institute for Global Development (IGD)





Project Goal:

This project focuses on language acquisition from a multimodal language representation perspective as well as from a cultural perspective of learning. While most immigration authorities rely on language testing and language teaching according to intuitive teaching models, it has to date not been thoroughly investigated how such acquisition processes function. We combine empirical methods such as eyetracking and EEG to learn about language acquisition mechanisms and to compare L1 abilities with L2 learning processes.

The Salzburg Speech Clinic (SSC) ['ʃpra:x?ambu:lants]

At the Salzburg Speech Clinic (SSC) we provide pro bono, culturally sensitive training for dyslexic children from mono- and multilingual backgrounds. The Salzburg Speech Clinic is also a teaching facility offering university level clinical education and training for graduate students. The areas of expertise regarding clinical research range from developmental and acquired communication disorders to multicultural issues in speech language pathology.



At the Salzburg Speech Clinic (SSC) we offer:

- A three- month Graduate Certificate Program in Multicultural and Multilingual Concerns in Communication Disorders (MCD) on site in Salzburg, Austria
- Internships for students enrolled in our Master Program: MS in Communication Sciences and Disorders
- Research opportunities for students and fellows at the Bilingual Phonology Lab (BPL), a sub-division of the Culture and Science Lab (CSL)

Bilingual children (2L1) simultaneously acquire two languages in the same time window in which monolingual children learn one. How do they do that? The Bilingual Phonology Lab (BPL) aims at finding out more about this. Little is known about typical phonological acquisition in bilingual children, and even less is known about bilingual children with phonological disorders.





The long-term goals of our Bilingual Phonology Lab are to (1) determine the trajectory of typical acquisition in bilingual children, taking into consideration how the two languages (2L1) of bilingual children interact; (2) determine how disorders present themselves in children who maintain two speech sound systems, and (3) develop evidence-based assessment and intervention tools to help bilingual children with phonological disorders become effective communicators in both languages.

The most valuable experiences are the direct result of meeting and interacting with people.



III. EcoHimal – Spend your Time Inspiring and Supporting Nepal's Future

The InterCultural Center is very proud to cooperate with EcoHimal in terms of internships for our students.

For EcoHimal, the Society for Cooperation Alps – Himalaya, the commitment towards sustainable development is the foundation for our involvement in Nepal, Tibet and Pakistan. EcoHimal supports development projects in the Himalayan-Hindukush regions and is actively involved in education on development policy in the Alpine countries. Our work focuses on health, sustainable agriculture and tourism, regional development and cultural cooperation.

The "Future for the Children in Nepal" project (EcoHimal Academy) is an education project for abandoned kids, war orphans and very poor children from the remote valleys of the Himalaya. EcoHimal funds with donations formal education and vocational training, clothing and school uniforms, books and writing utensils, accommodation, food and care. Education overcomes poverty – these efforts may lead to positive development processes of individuals and hence has the potential to change a community. Currently 25 kids are in this program and are taught in an English speaking boarding school in Kathmandu.

Prof. Dr. Luger is the Chairman of EcoHimal and coordinator of this project and chairs the ICC panel which selects suitable internship projects to be realized in Kathmandu.







IV. CeTeCh – Be part of our Sustainable Development Project in Nicaragua

CeTeCh (Centro de Capacitación Técnico Chichigalpa / Technical Training Center Chichigalpa) is a development project in Nicaragua established and supported by CHICA-Austria, the Nicaragua-Committee Wels, ASDECOSI (Association for Community Development with International Solidarity) and the Austrian Development Agency (ADA).

The training center CeTeCh aims at fostering community development of the municipality of Chichigalpa in Western Nicaragua. Our project focuses on long-term improvement of living conditions of marginalized youth in Chichigalpa as well as on the establishment of sustainable educational structures. In order to realise these goals we offer various classes in mechanics, electrical engineering and photovoltaics at CeTeCh. The primary ambition is to develop renewable and cost-reducing energy solutions (photovoltaics, solar panels and eco-stoves). Together with the Austrian coordinators of the project, Eva Gaderer and Robert M. Bichler, and the local director of CeTeCh, your cultural mentor on site, you will embark on a life-changing internship.
